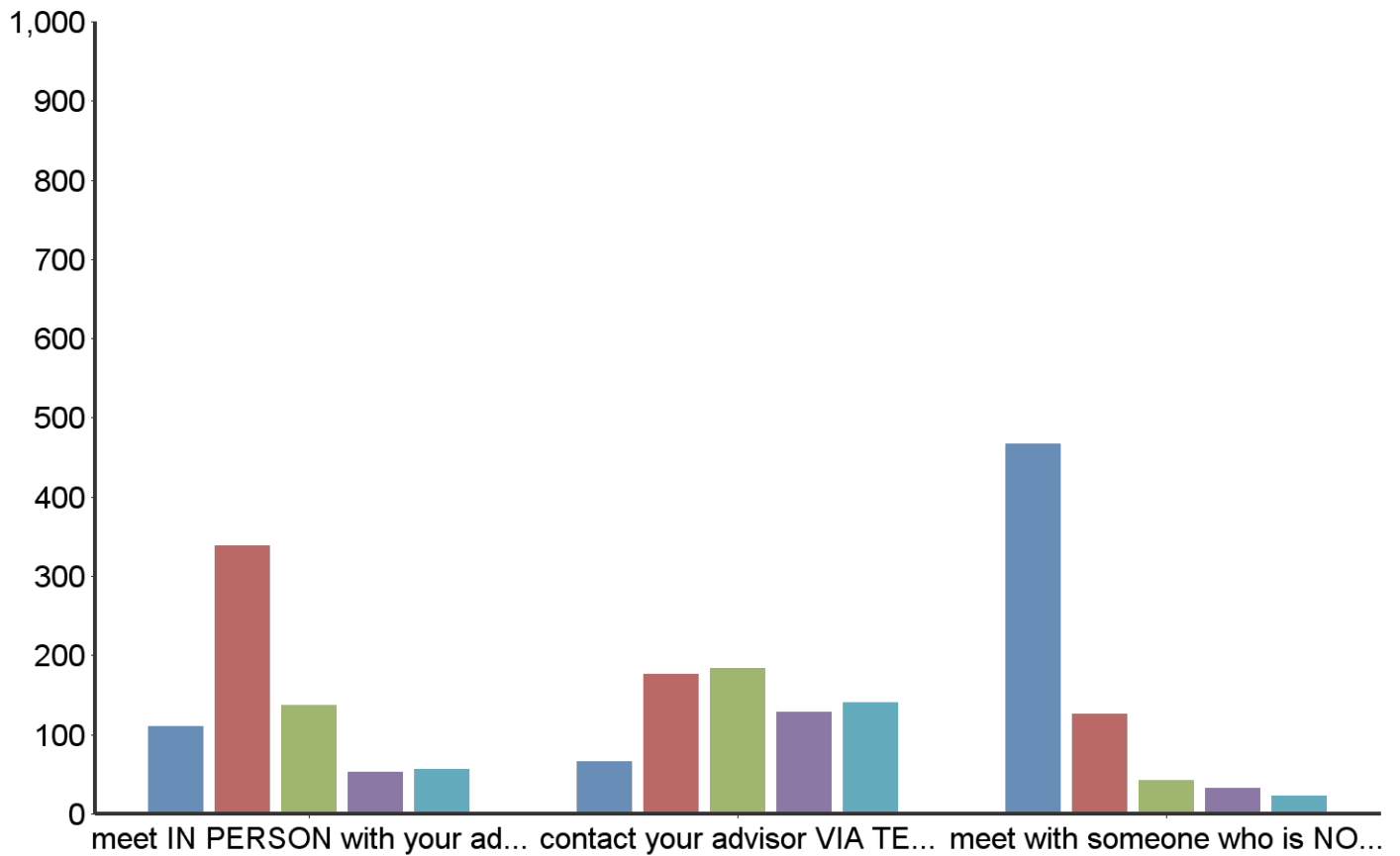

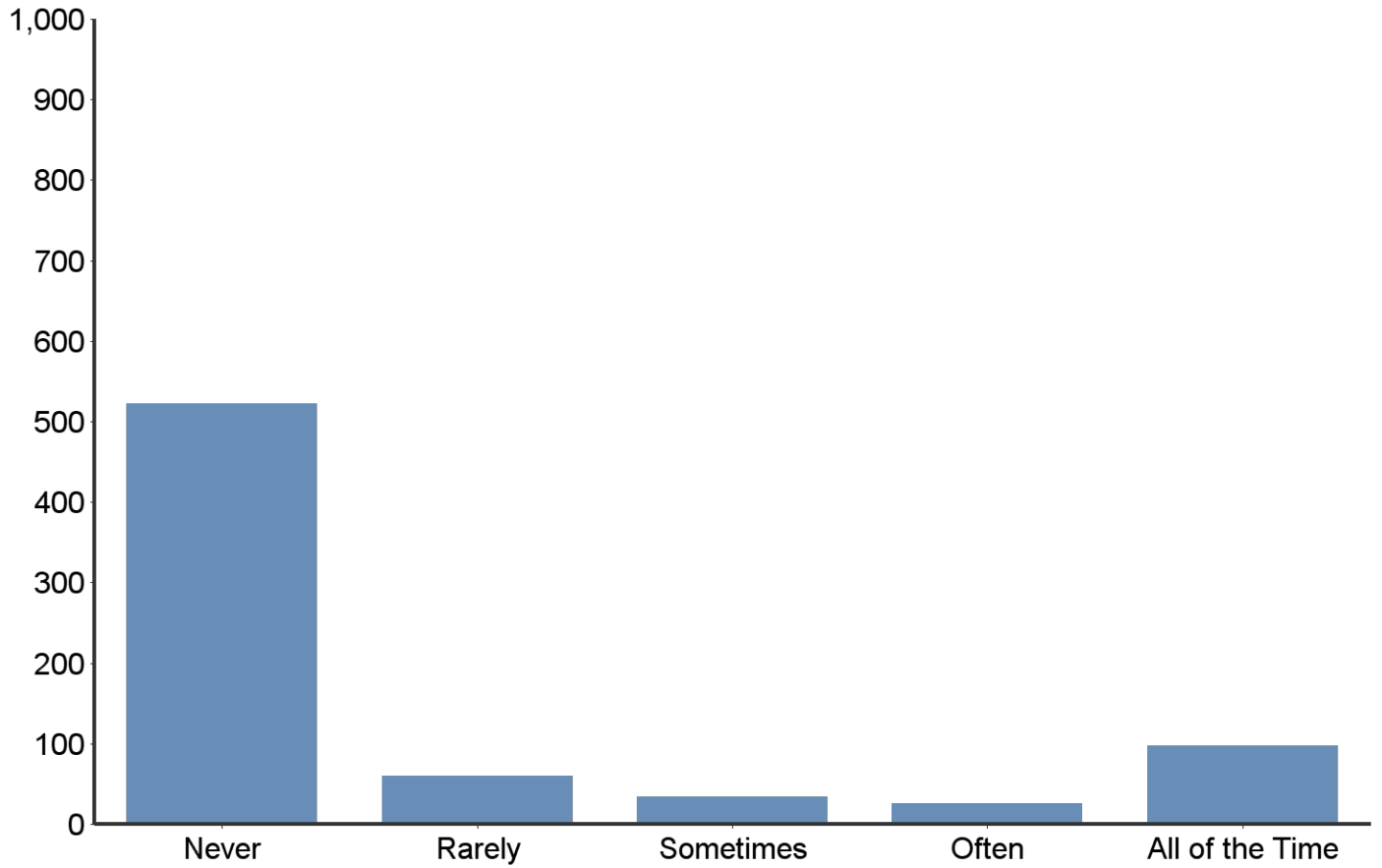
How often do you...

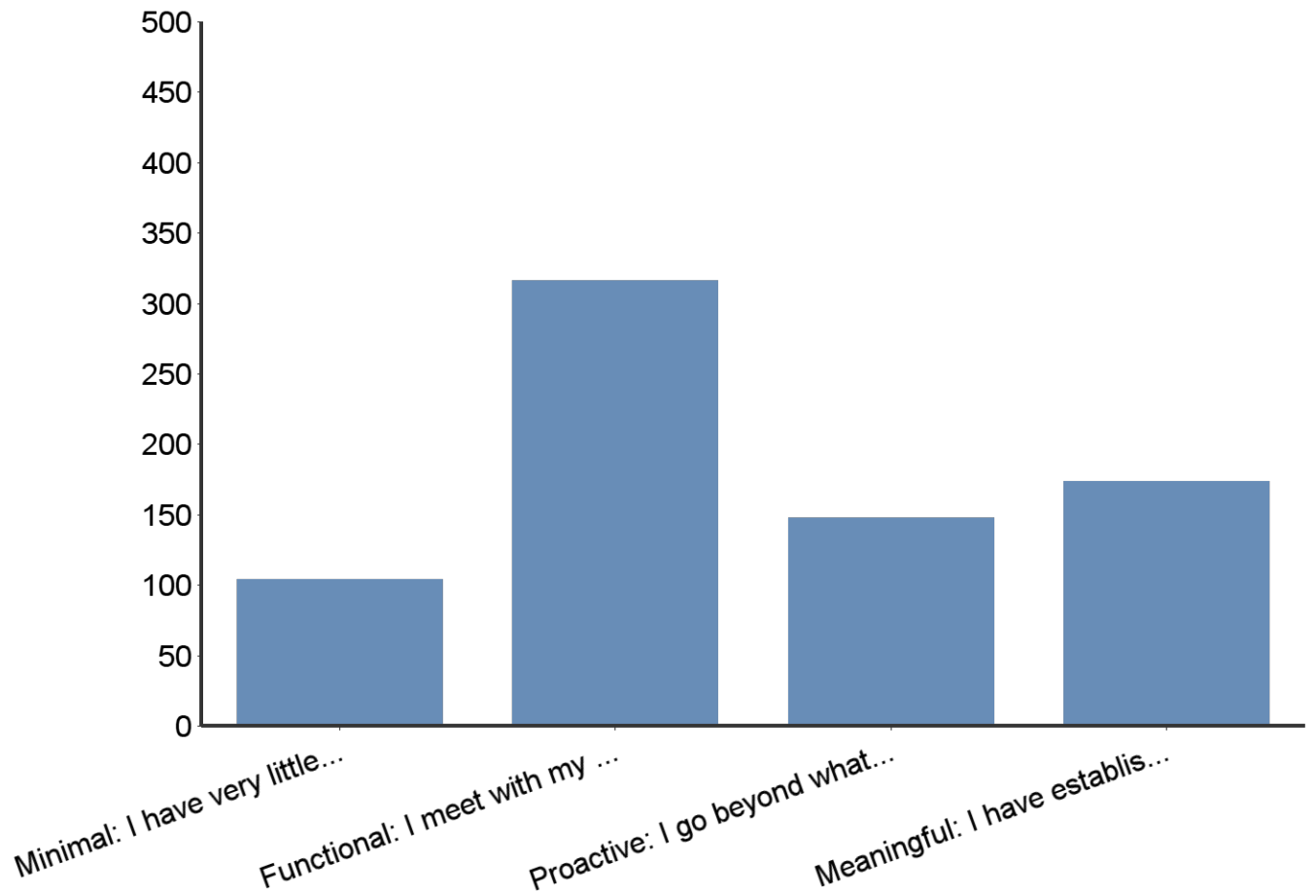

Does your advisor give you your RAC number without meeting with you?



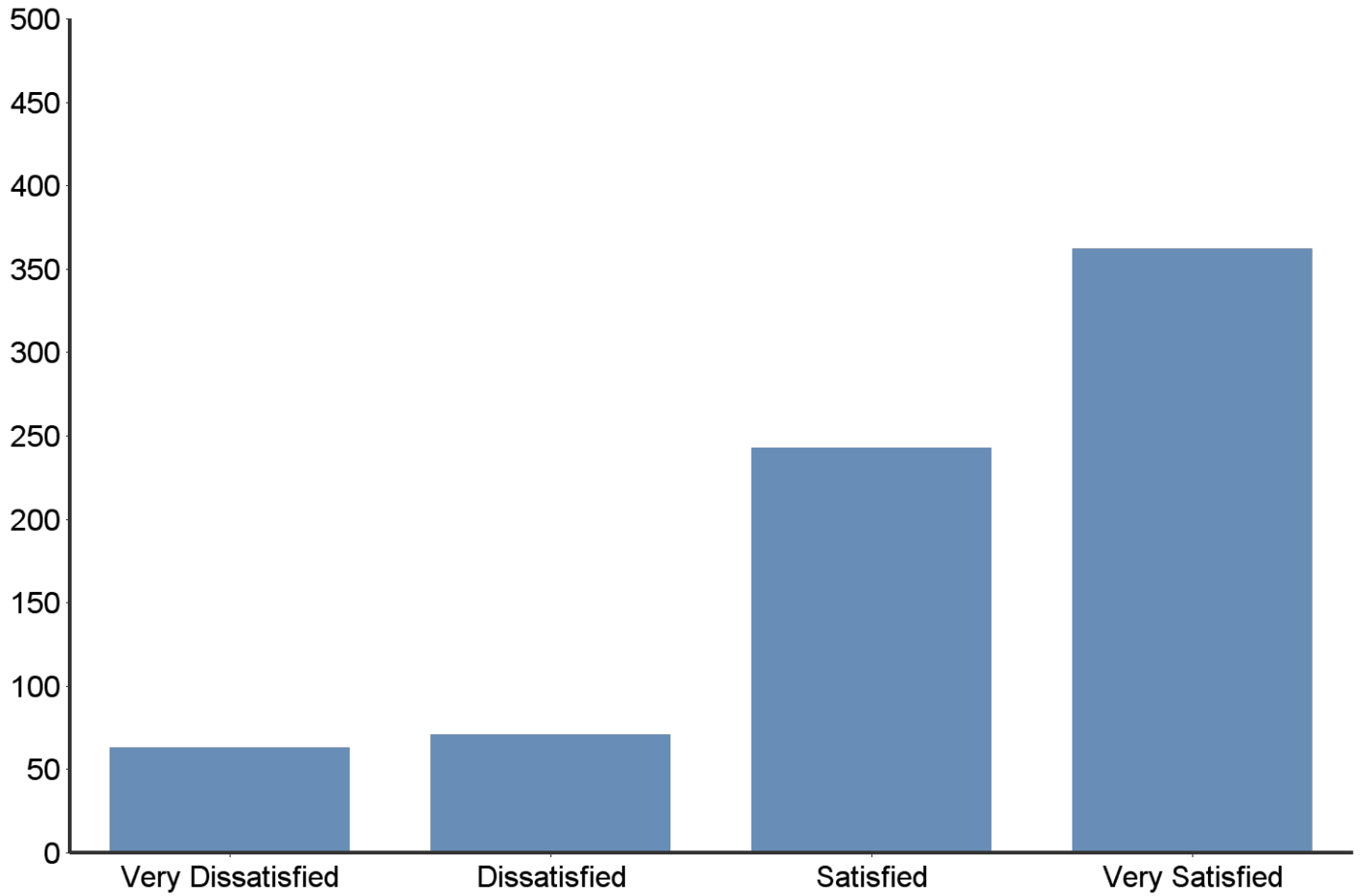

Dr. Bill Staddon is amazing as an adviser and the above survey is in relation to him. I however had a VERY poor and very subpar experience with the associate chair of the BIOS department, Dr. Stephen Sumithran. I have had to visit him too many times this semester due to scheduling mishaps on my behalf (namely a botched bankruptcy of credits). He advised me to change to the new curriculum as it would be easier and less classes on my behalf. When I reminded him of this he denied ever suggesting that he advised me to do it and even said "I would never advise a student to change to the new curriculum." After I begged for some sort of help in the problems I was having he showed no signs of giving in and helping advise me, he even went as far as suggesting that I was lying (because I let him know that a credit from Berea College had transferred to EKU when I was initially enrolled [2011] and because I swore to him of his advice). At long last I told him that I supposed that I would have to go to the Registrar to prevent myself from being "screwed" out of an extra \$5,000 for having to take a class that I didn't need. He ended our conversation with, and I quote (in a snide, bengali accent), "Well you should do that because I cannot do anything. You are screwed." This absolute lack of professionalism and blatant disregard for student success is appalling and something that I have never been exposed to in any department at EKU. Good news though, I ran into Dr. Frank Fontanella (my professor for BIO 495) and he directed me to his wife at the registrar and was very willing to offer any help if need be. I also caught Dr. Staddon in his office moments after that and he has since gone above and beyond to help me figure out what needs to be done with minimal stress to everyone.
